Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPEs)

Students complete eight, five-week advanced pharmacy practice experiences (APPEs) beginning in the summer following the third year and throughout the fourth year. Students complete three rotations for two semesters (15 weeks x 2) and two rotations for one semester (10 weeks). Students will have experiences in acute care and ambulatory care (3 rotations, community pharmacy, institutional pharmacy, populations/systems-based care, as well as elective options. (5 credits per rotation = 40 credit hours for the year).

Professional Development Electives

Eight hours of professionally related electives are required to be completed during the second and third professional year. Professional development electives can be selected from a list of approved courses. Students can also choose to participate in one of our pathway programs, where electives and one or more APPE rotations are concentrated in a pathway.
