- Identify vaccines available for hepatitis

Pharmacy Law: Updates for 2018 (Knowledge-based)

- Describe new laws and rules passed by the West Virginia Legislature 2018 impacting pharmacy practice.
- Discuss federal pharmacy law cases having an impact in the practice of pharmacy in West Virginia.
- Identify changes to controlled substance prescribing and monitoring in West Virginia.
