Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPEs)

Students complete eight, five-week APPEs beginning in the summer following the third year and throughout the fourth year. Students complete three rotations for two semesters and two rotations for one semester. Rotations include acute care and ambulatory care (3 rotations), community pharmacy (1), institutional pharmacy (1), populations/systems-based care (1), and electives (2 rotations). (5 credits per rotation = 40 credits total).

Professional Development Electives

Eight hours of professionally related electives are required to be completed during the second and third professional year. Professional development electives can be selected from a list of approved courses.
